*James Plant appeared by his attorney for a fourth day against John
Newton of Northrode in county Chester husbondman and Katherine Plant
widow, executors of the testament of William Plante, in a plea that they
render him £7 10s that they unjustly withhold from him &c. And (the
defendants) have not come. And it had been ordered the sheriffs to
summon them &c. And the sheriffs now report that they have nothing (in
their bailiwick in lands or chattels whereby they might be attached) &c.
Therefore let them be taken, to be here on the quindene of Easter &c.*
