May 28. Westminster. Commission to Hugh Cammoys, knight, Thomas Wrotting and William Ballard to enquire touching the digging of pits near the hospital of St. John Baptist, Basingstoke, co. Southampton, by men of the town, and the casting therein of fetid hides and other filth, so that on account of the stench the ministers of the hospital, a free chapel of the king, are hindered from celebrating divine service.
- June 8. Westminster. Commission to Baldwin Fryvyle and John de Catesby to enquire touching the title by which William Palmer holds certain lands and tenements in Coventre, Ocundon and Radford, co. Warwick, late of Roger Oky, which should be escheated to the Crown on account of the death of Roger without heir.
- June 12. Westminster. Prohibition of all archbishops and other ecclesiastics, and John de Bircheover, clerk, in particular, from doing anything prejudicial to the king's right in his free chapel of All Saints, Derby, which is exempt from all ordinary jurisdiction.

- June 19. Westminster. Appointment of Roger de Fulthorp and William Thirnyng as justices to take assizes, juries and certifications arraigned before justices in the counties of York, Northumberland, Cumberland and Westmoreland. By C.

MEMBRANE 7d.

- May 26. Westminster. Commission to William de Skipwith, Roger de Kirketon and Robert Tresilian to examine, in the presence of the mayor and aldermen of the city of London, and correct any error in the record and process of a suit in which Richard de Notyngnam, citizen and mercer of London, sued Robert Mauncell, citizen and mercer of London, before the mayor and aldermen in the chamber of the Guildhall (*Guyhalde*) to render his account to him for the time when he was his receiver, wherein they submitted to arbitration, and Richard did not proceed further. The mayor and aldermen decreed that Robert should pay Richard 167*l.* 11*s.* 8*d.* and be detained in prison till he had satisfied him of it, and that a certain writing of quitclaim which Robert had put forward to exclude Richard from his action should be cancelled.

- June 16. Westminster. Commission to Thomas de Aston, John de Verdon, sheriff of Stafford, Richard de Thornebury, and Henry de Sutton, to arrest and deliver to the Marshalsea prison Henry de Bradshawe of Leek, Thomas Page, Robert le Wright of Leek, the younger, Richard del Kechen of Leek, Richard de Bradshawe, Richard de Fernyhalgh of Leek, Thomas le Coke of Leek, Nicholas le Hunte of Leek, William Balle of Leek, and Robert Tuppeheved of Leek, who killed John de Warton at Leek on Saturday after Easter, 2 Richard II.; and also Edmund de Draycote, cellarer of William de Lichefeld, abbot of St. Mary, Dieuleucres, Robert de Berford, William Dyke of Leek, and William del Brugge, vicar of Leek, who with the said abbot harboured them.
