*Thomas Palmer esquire appeared in person for a fourth day against
Edmund Plant of Hurdesfeld in county Chester drover, in a plea that he
render him £4 that he owes him and unjustly withholds &c. And (the
defendant) has not come; and, as many times, it had been ordered the
sheriff to take him if &c. and safe &c. so that he have his body here on
this day, namely on the octaves of Hilary. And the sheriff now reports that
(the defendant) is not found &c. Therefore it is ordered the sheriff to
cause (the defendant) to be exacted from county (court) to county until
&c. (the defendant) shall be outlawed if he does not (appear) &c. And if
(he appear) then (the sheriff) shall take him, and safe &c. so that he have
his body here on the octaves of Midsummer; and whereof &c.*
