Mandate to assign to John Cambi, of Florence, and Nicholas Serboti, of Pistoia, factors for the society of the Bilioti, or Balioti, of Florence, 8000 florins, value 3s. 2d. each, collected in England and those parts, to be paid over to the papal *camera*, namely, 6000 by Bandinus Bonacursi, of the society of the Bonacursi, and 2000 by Francis Plantule, proctor of the Balioti.

To the bishop of St. Andrews. Mandate to ascertain the facts touching the complaint made by the guardians and convents of the Friars Minors of Berwick and Roxburg, in the dioceses of St. Andrews and Glasgow, that Adam Hanupli, Thomas de Irwy, and Adam de Adigton, at the suggestion of William de Dalgernoc, abbot, and the convent of Kelso, left the Friars Minors, carrying off from their churches and dwellings bibles, and other books, chalices and ornaments, and handing them over to the said abbot and convent. Restitution is to be made, and the said friars, abbot, and monks are to be corrected.

Mandate to assign 1000 marks collected in England and neighbouring parts to Pontius, Andrew, and Ateritus de Portinaris, factors of the society of the Bonacursi, of Florence, to be paid over to the papal *camera* by Bandinus Bonacursi, in good gold florins, value 38d. each.
